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# Central's first graders pay a visit to Chowan Hospital

"Hold to the Magic Yellow Rope!" This was the instruction given by Mrs. Claire Mills, Staff Development Coordinator at Chowan Hospital, to Mrs. Freda Nelson's 24 first grade students at Central Grammar School in Winfall on their visit October 25 to Chowan Hospital.

They held to the yellow rope as they were led on their visit to the different departments of the hospital. During their visit to the Pharmacy, Wallace Nelson, the Director of Pharmacy, talked to them about over-the-counter medications, the importance of reading labels, poison prevention and the work a pharmacist does.

They learned the rules about medicine: "(1) Never take medicine

without your parents' knowledge; (2) Never take unlabeled medication; and (3) Never take medicine without first reading the label."

# Local homemakers attendstate meeting

Six persons from Perquimans County attended the Annual State Extension Homemakers meeting at the Radisson Plaza in Raleigh Oc-

The theme: "Roanoke - Starting the Path - Extension Leading the Way." There were 340 homemakers in attendance.

The Northeastern District, which includes Perquimans County, was the host. State President, Mrs. Bertha Perry of Currituck, also lives in the district.

The Perquimans delegation left a day early in order to help with last minute preparations for the meeting.

Those attending from the county were Mrs. Ann (Joe Towe) White, Northeastern District President; Mrs. Marian Frierson, Perquimans County Extension Council President; Mrs. Thelma (C. T. Rogerson), First Vice President of the County Extension Council; Mrs. Emma (Clarence) Burke; Second Vice President of the County Council; Mrs. Linn Hillborn, Member at Large; and Mrs. Paige Underwood, County Home Economics Agent.

Mrs. White gave one of the welcomes at the Wednesday Evening

Guest speaker, Marjorie Griffin, National President of the Extension Homemakers Council Association Inc., spoke on the subject "Don't Just Stand There - Be One." (A volun-

Other participants on the program were: Dr. Chester Black, Associate Dean and Director of the N.C. Agriculture Extension Service NCSU; Dr. Martha Johnson, Assistant Director in Charge of Home Economics N.C.

Mr. Nelson related to the students the four parts of a prescription label and stressed the importance of taking the medication only as prescribed. As an example, "If one teaspoon is good, two teaspoons will not necessarily be better."

They were shown the tools which the pharmacist uses in preparing the patients' medications and given an explanation of how they are used. Another area which he discussed was poison prevention.

He had them cite examples of poisons in their own homes, explaining the dnagers of ingesting poisons. Each student was given a telephone sticker listing the Poison Control Center telephone number.

Following their visit to the Pharmacy, the yellow rope led them to the Nursery to see the babies, to Data Processing to watch the computer work, to the Food Service Kitchen to see how the food is prepared and to Radiology to see the x-ray equipment and the x-ray of the stomach of a child who had swallowed a coin.

They were then served refreshments in the cafeteria and given a coloring book depicting situations they might encounter should they become a hospital patient.
