New x-ray equipment reduces radiation

Albemarle Hospital's Radiology Department has recently installed new intensifying screens and has changed the type of X-ray film it uses, thus reducing the radiation exposure to the patients by 50 percent.

According to Bob Carson, director of radiology services at Albemarle Hospital, this technology has been available for some time, but

drawbacks existed with respect to loss of detail. "Recent enhancements enable us

to use a super speed X-ray film with no loss of detail" said Carson. In addition to reducing radiation

exposure to patients, maintenance of the x-ray equipment should be less costly, said Carson, because the load placed, on the X-ray tube is also reduced by 50 percent.
