

ANISEIKONIA

ANISEIKONIA means that there are unequal sized or shaped images sent to the brain from each eye. For normal, comfortable,

binocular vision, the difference cannot be more than three or four

percent. A greater amount can procedure symptoms of mild to severe headaches and even double vision.

When the prescription for the lenses in the two eyes differ drastically from lens to lens, aniseikonia is a probability. Sometimes the very glasses which correct other vision defects will produce the condition. That being the case, you would be tested for aniseikonia. Unfortunately this doesn't always happen.

This is too bad, because the symptoms of this condition can be relived readily with special glasses or contact lenses. The most important thing is detection.

important thing is detection. It has been estimated that there may be millions of people who suffer the discomforts of aniseikonia without even knowing it.


