grammar school, and the whole wooden building was given for use of the library. When the grammar school burned in 1956 the brick lunch room was not damaged, and when the school was reopened in another part of town the brick lunchroom was given over entirely to the library.

A bookmobile was put into operation going through the county taking books and magazines to the elderly, to children and others who could not come to the library.

Before this time a state-wide library system was organized and financial aid was given to each county that participated.

A bill that established this was largely the work of Senator Charles Whedbee who travelled over the entire state talking to each member of the legislature to interest them in statewide support of public li-

Some years later this county took over the entire local support of the library and spent about \$50,000 in renovations of the building, adding a wing, new shelves and furnishings. In addition to state aid and county funds, the Perquimans County Library was made one of the beneficiaries of the Thomas G. Skinner Trust Fund, set up by the heirs of T.G. Skinner, a former resident of the county. This money was designated for the purpose of purchasing books. With this and state aid and county funds the collection of books grew rapidly.

In its 50 years the Perquimans County Library Board has had only four people serv(Continued from page 1)
