of Portsmouth, Va. second and third respectively. Tommy Cherry of South Mills, NC led from start to finish to capture the second heat in the Coors Super Street Division.
In the Budweiser Sportsman Hampton, VA took the first heat followed by Bubba Adams and Bert Culpepper of Chesapeake, Va. Defending track champion, Mike Buffkin of Tabb, Va., captured top honors in the second heat followed by Roger Hicks and Bill Brickhouse of Cheap-
eake, Va.
The Mighty Mini Division time rialed for positions and Bobby Cahoon had the fastest time of the evening. Cahoon took command of the event and never relinquished the lead, thus winning
