Perhaps that's why the teenage suicide rate has climbed

rate by a shocking 280 percent. One of the primary causes is the widespread use of alcohol and drugs, which experts. blame for more than half of last year's teenage suicides, more than 3,000 In mill

Dr. James D. Vargo, chief of staff at Ridgeview Institute in Smyrna, Ga. It is usually pre-
