REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

- IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS ABOUT REGISTRATION OR NEED ANY COUNSELING HELP WITH YOUR PROGRAM OF STUDY, you are invited to visit COA's Student Development Office, Building A, Highway 17 North, prior to registration to talk with a counselor. New applicants are advised to see a counselor and/or faculty member to complete a trial schedule prior to registration.
- NEW APPLICANTS MUST HAVE APPLICATIONS ON FILE IN THE ADMISSIONS OFFICE AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION.
- To register, report to the Main Entrance of Building A and sign in at the Reception Area.
- Institutional policies require that students receiving financial aid must register during the early registration period (not the first week of classes) to have their tuition and fees taken from their financial aid checks.
- If you are sick or otherwise cannot register during the above dates, a friend or family member will be permitted to register for you provided you have submitted an official application and they are prepared to pay your tuition and fees.
- ALL TUITION AND FEES ARE DUE AND PAYABLE AT TIME OF REGISTRATION. Tuition and fees are paid at the Cashier's Window, Building A. All past accounts owed the College must be paid before permission to register can be given.
- INDIVIDUALS ENROLLING IN OFF-CAMPUS EVENING COURSES MAY REGISTER AND PAY TUITION AT THE FIRST CLASS MEETING.

ADMISSION INFORMATION

College Transfer and Occupational

Applicants to the College who wish to enroll in a curriculum program must complete a general application and request that official transcripts from the high school (or GED results) and postsecondary schools attended be forwarded to the Admissions Office prior to registration. Applicants to two-year degree programs and some vocational programs are required to take placement tests. Refer to the registration calendar for test dates and times.

Non-Degree Students

Individuals who wish to register for one or more credit courses but do not intend to pursue a degree or diploma will be required to complete a general application prior to registration.
