Deductions available

GREENSBORO-You may have a little something extra coming to you, depending on your county of resi-

According to the Internal Revenue Service, North Carolina Taxpayers may be able to deduct an amount in addition to the sales tax tables published in the Federal income tax instructions. First of all, the tables have been revised to reflect 1986 costs of living and offer larger deductions. But in addition, the 11/2 percent local sales taxes which have been adopted by various counties in the last several months mean even larger deductions.

Since the sales tax tables were printed before many of the local sales taxes took effect, the footnote for North Carolina (number 11) should be ignored.

-Taxpayers residing in the following counties and itemizing their deductions should compute the amount on the sales tax table and then adjust it by the following percentage.

For example Perquimans, Add 4 percent, Pasquotank, add 4 percent and Chowan, add 4 percent.

Tax returns filed for 1986 will be the last on which any sales taxes can be claimed. So be sure you claim the full amount to which you are entitled.

Medal at Fort Bragg, N.C. The Achievement Medal is awarded to soldiers for meritorious service, acts of courage, or other


acomplishments. Winslow is an indirect-fire infantryman with the Noncommissioned Officers' Academy.


