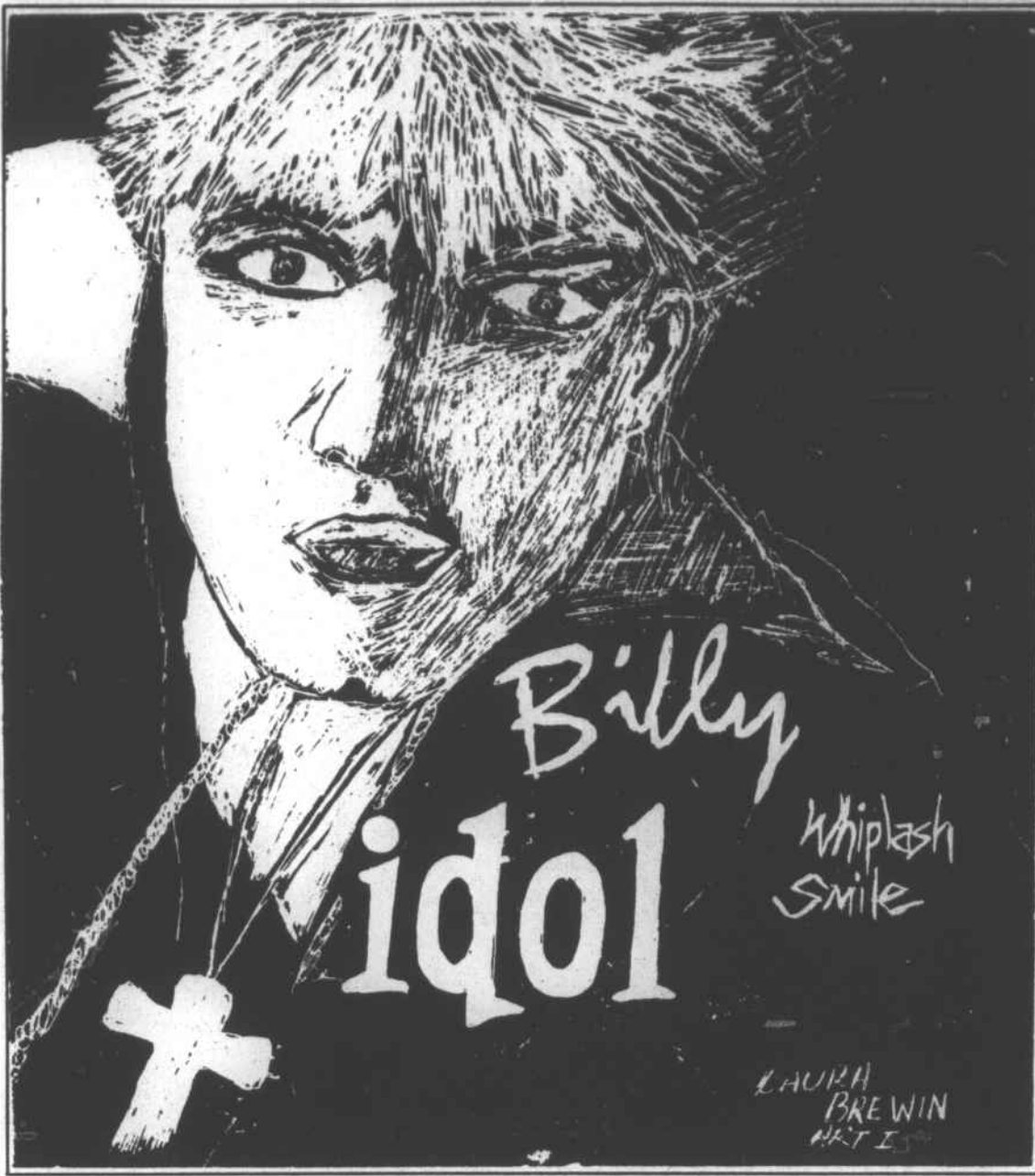

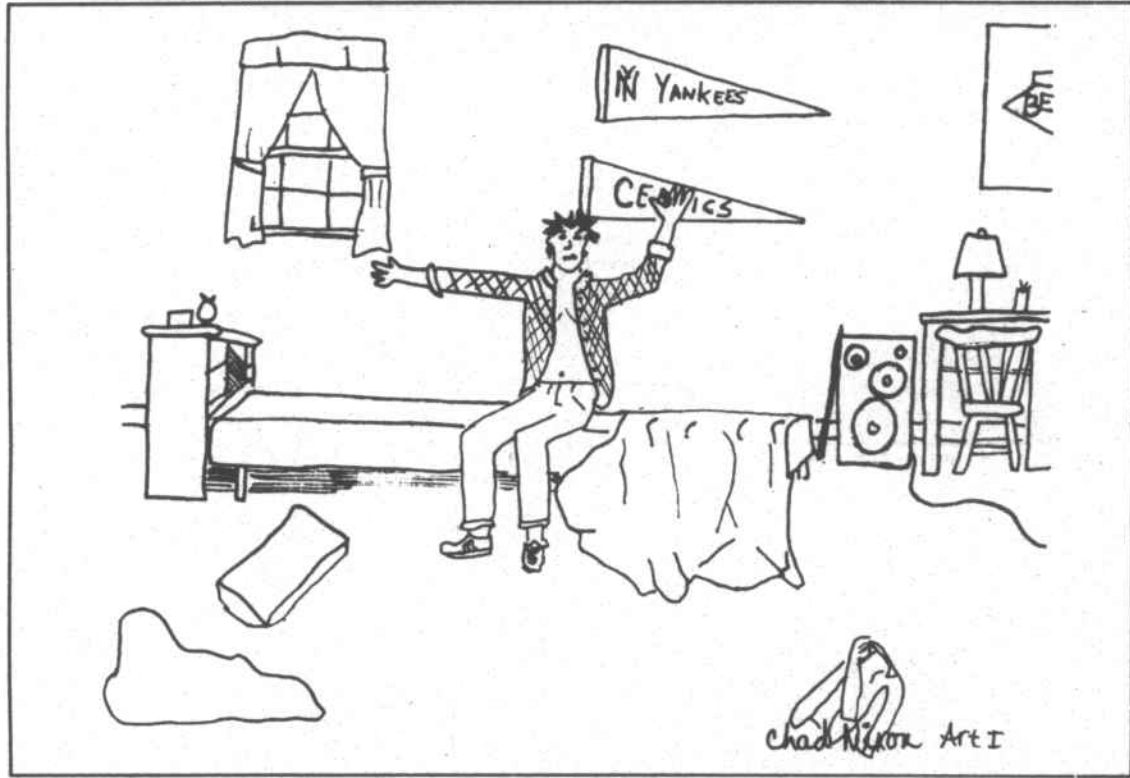


Pictured left are samples of sketch pad work done in some of the Art I classes at Perquimans High School in Hertford.
