## Coates, White selected to attend seminar

The North Carolina Museum of Art invited Deborah Phillips Coates and one of her students, Bruce White to attend the N.C. Museum of Art Statewide Seminar for High School Art Teachers and Students.  
Forty teachers and forty students from across the state were selected to attend the seminar on April 11th. The seminar offered both the students and teachers a unique opportunity to meet one of America's most

distinguished artist, Mr. Jacob Lawrence.  
Mr. Lawrence is known for his many activities including his teaching at the fabled Black Mountain School of North Carolina in 1946 with Bauhaus master Josef Albers, his famous portrait which appeared on the cover of Time Magazine in 1970, and his many exhibitions which have been held at museums such as the Whitney Museum of Art in New York,

and the Seattle Art Museum.  
During the course of the seminar students and teachers were given the opportunity to meet with Mr. Lawrence, tour the 20th century galleries, and students had a discussion on "Art after High School" with Professor Jim Starrett of the N.C.S.U. School of Design.  
Teachers also took part in a discussion on using the Museum as a resource.

# Older Americans urged to get immunizations

**RALEIGH**—State health officials are urging all North Carolinians, especially those over age 50, to make sure they are properly immunized against tetanus and diphtheria.  
According to Dr. J.N. MacCormack, chief of the Epidemiology Section of the Department of Human Resources' Division of Health Services, the chance of getting tetanus, also known as lockjaw, is greatest during spring and summer.  
"The tetanus germ is found in soil and dust," MacCormack said. "With more people enjoying the outdoors during warmer weather, especially with gardening and lawn work, the chance of the tetanus germ entering the body is greater. Once the germ enters the body, it creates a toxin which causes the muscles to go into spasms and then lock unless the person has been properly immunized."  
He pointed out that most people think that tetanus results from contact with rusty nails. However, it can enter the body through a minor cut, puncture wound or burn caused by anything ranging from a cat's scratch to a thorn prick.  
The last two cases of tetanus reported in North Carolina occurred in 1985, a decrease from 1983 when there were five tetanus victims.  
MacCormack said that health officials are concerned about the age of tetanus victims.  
"In 1952, the average age of tetanus patients was 15 years old. Of the 11 cases reported since 1980, however, eight were 55 years or older," he explained. "This indicates that our older citizens are not keeping up with their tetanus shots. This is especially important because older people and newborn infants are less likely to survive the disease."  
Tetanus immunization for adults includes an initial series of three shots followed by a booster shot every 10 years. Tetanus and diphtheria

vaccine are usually combined into one shot. Most children in North Carolina receive their tetanus and diphtheria vaccination along with other basic immunizations before starting school; however, it is important that they get their boosters every 10 years, too.  
"The treatment for tetanus is lengthy and expensive," MacCor-

mack said. "About all that can be done for a tetanus victim is to sedate the patient and simply wait out the disease. This could mean three to four weeks in a hospital, or possibly even longer."  
He added that the cost for a tetanus vaccination is very small compared to actual treatment, which averages about \$14,000 per case.
