Veterans are invited to join the Local VFW Post, become active members, and support the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW).

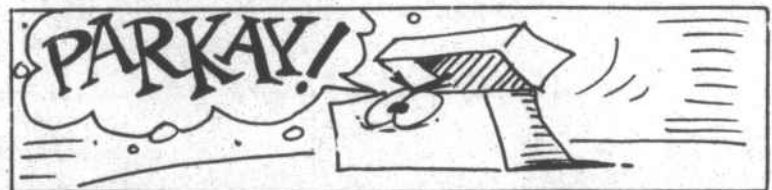
AARP news
