The program was written and produced by the Historic Sites Section for the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources.

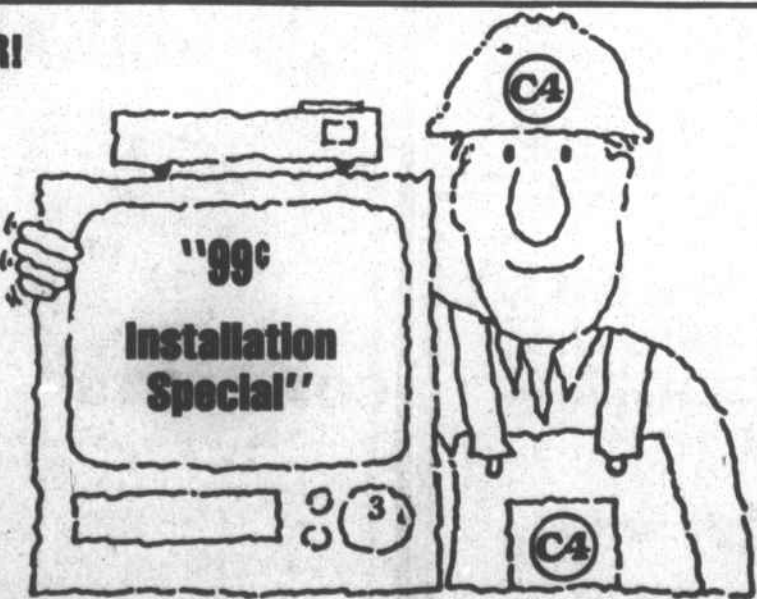
