NCSU lunches campaign

The North Carolina State University Alumni Association has launched its 1987-88 Loyalty Fund campaign for Perquimans County. Serving as county chairman and area coordinator for the fund-raising drive is Wayne Howell of Hertford.

Funds raised by the Alumni Association are used to support academic programs at NCSU. The association's main program, the John T. Caldwell Alumni Scholarship program, currently provides 103 merit-based scholarships valued at \$3,500 per year for in-state students and \$4,700 per year for out-of-state students.

In conjunction with the Loyalty Fund campaign, the association also is conducting a fund-raising campaign for a new campus landmark—the Alumni Centennial Gateway. With contributions from alumni, an 18-foot-high, 128-foot-long stainless-steel wall, surrounded by flowering crabapple trees, will be erected at the intersection of Western Boulevard and Gorman Street in Raleigh.

The total estimated cost of the project is \$450,000.
