ECSU NAMES WALTON NEW HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Elizabeth City State Universi-ty's Athletic Director Dr. Curtis Williams announced the naming of Johnnie B. Walton as ECSU's new head football coach.

Walton is no stranger to the po-sition of coach at ECSU. He pre-viously held the position from 1979-1983. Walton, since 1986, has been employed as assistant vice chancellor for development and planning at ECSU. He also is an alumnus of ECSU. He received his B.S. degree in 1969. He has also attended Hampton Institute.

Chancellor Jimmy R. Jenkins states, "Naturally, I am proud to accept the recommendation of Dr. Williams and to appoint Mr. Walton as head football coach. I believe that as an alumnus of the university and one who has been directly or indirectly involved with the athletic program for more than 13 years, Mr. Walton is uniquely capable of under-standing the direction we are attempting to take the school, and I believe he can more easily embrace the program.
