Historic ship available for fall, spring Albemarle sails

The Historic Sites Section of the N. C. Department of Cultural Resources now is scheduling fall and spring voyages for the Elizabeth II. This ship is North Carolina's representative 16th century sailing vessel.

Since her maiden voyage in the fall 1985, the Elizabeth II has completed seven voyages to various ports in North Carolina, including New Bern, Beaufort, Wilmington, Edenton, and Washington.

The Elizabeth II will be available to sail from its home port of Man-

to during the fall of 1989 and the spring of 1990. Host ports must pay for voyage costs. These include travel and subsistence for crew and staff, as well as tugboat expenses. Interest ports should plan for the ship to be open to the public in their community for a minimum of three days.
