

# Perquimans County Schools receives \$100,000 grant

Perquimans County Schools will receive one of four Transitional Services for Youth with Disabilities Grants. The grant was written by Brenda Terranova, exceptional children program administrator, and other

exceptional children staff members. The grant has been made available through the federally funded North Carolina Interagency Transition Services of the Department of Human Resources. The funding amount for

the first year of the two-year grant will be \$50,000.

The school system anticipates receiving \$50,000 for the second year of the project, 1994-95, based upon the school system's performance during the

1993-94 period and the school system's second year application. Funding of the grants is contingent upon the receipt of funds from the U. S. Department of Education.

The funds from this project

will be used for exceptional students age 14 through the time when they exit school, and will address employment of a transition coordinator; instructional programs as they relate to employment; involvement of com-

munity resources; employment; other post school learning activities; daily living skills; and become a regional training center, assisting other local education agencies.

In lieu of flowers, the family suggests memorial gifts to a charity.

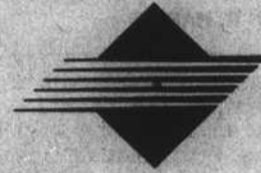
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
