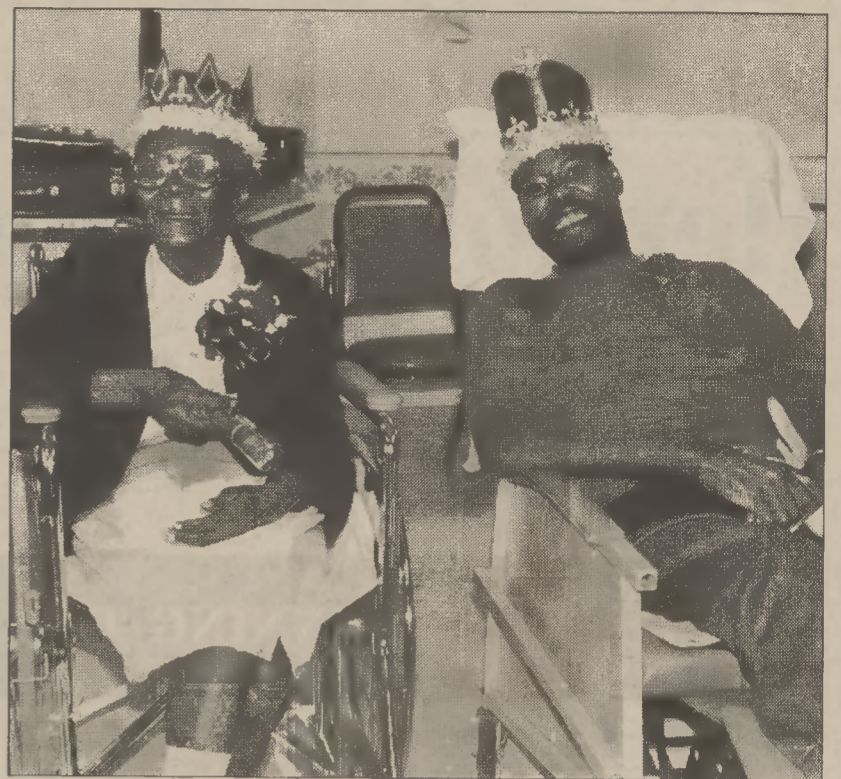

## Water quality stressed

The Albemarle Soil and Water Conservation District and the Natural Resources Conservation Service have been working to improve water quality in the Albemarle Sound and its tributaries.

Recently, cooperators with farms located on Raccoon Creek watershed in Perquimans County attended a meeting to hear discussion on participation in this program. Dwane Hinson, District conservationist with the Natural Resources Conservation Service, conducted the meeting. Her stressed water and nutri-

ent management as keys to improving and/or maintaining good water quality in the Albemarle area.

Landowners are encouraged to voluntarily decrease nutrient run-off with the cost share program, which provides partial funding to cover installation costs of conservation practices.

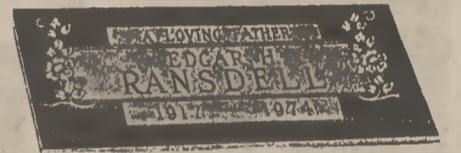
