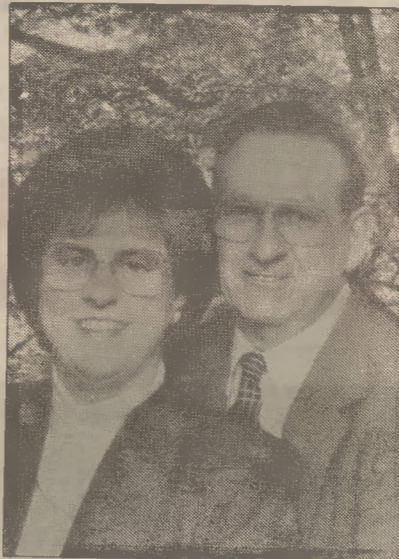

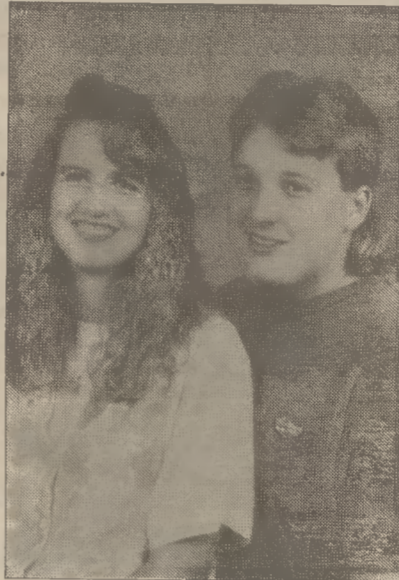
Finnegan-Hollowell
