Ted and Mimi Weeks

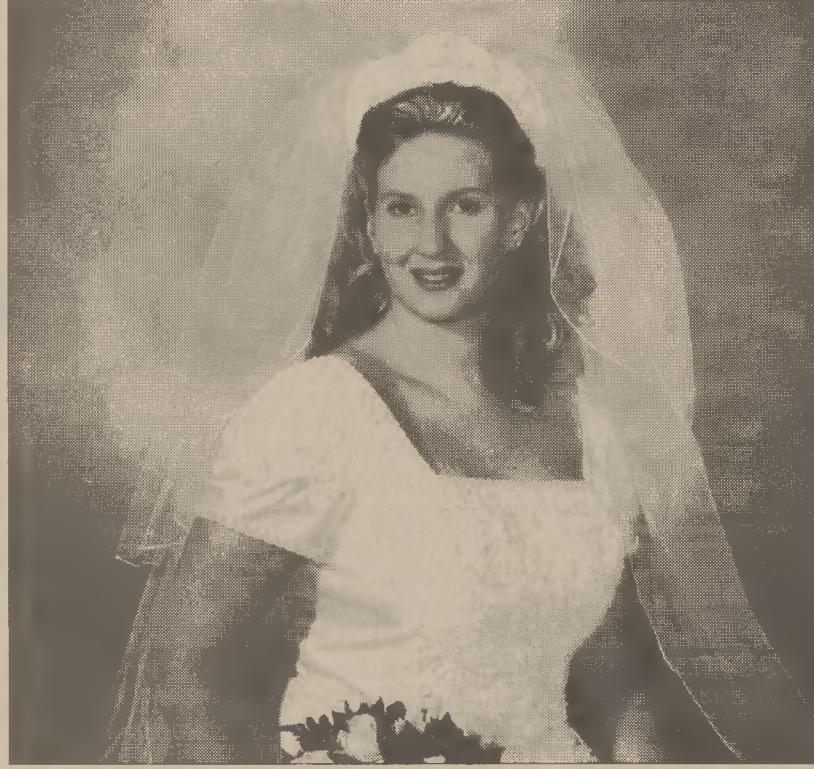
Weeks wed 40 years
