No arrests have been made in the case of a Hertford teenager gunned down in front of his home on King Street just after 9 p.m. Thursday.

Shakim Rolon Warren, 17, was struck by a bullet in his upper body and was pronounced dead at the scene, according Hertford Police Chief Dale Vanscoy.
