Parr addresses DAR

At the November meeting of the Edenton Tea Party Chapter, NSDAR, Sarah Parr, site manager of the Newbold-White House in Hertford, presented a fascinating program on colonial clothes and costuming.

Her demonstration and talk included fabric identification and the historical use of linen, cotton, silk and wool. She also showed how each piece of colonial clothing was made and dressed a mannequin in the historically correct manner. Also included in her talk was a brief history of the colonial era.

Prior to coming to Hertford and the Newbold-White House, Ms. Parr worked at the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation interpreting local and statewide history from the

18th century forward.

While at Mary Washington College, Sarah worked as a costume shop assistant constructing, fitting and making pattern costumes for stage productions. She also researched, constructed, fit and patterned historically accurate clothing for on-site interpreters while working as a costume technician at the Jamestown-Yorktown Foundation.

Currently at the Newbold-White House, Parr oversees daily operations of the site and interprets, furnishes, develops exhibits and coordinates ongoing restoration of the site.

Parr is a prospective member of the chapter and will soon submit her papers for verification by the National Society.

USDA Rural Development has low down payment home loans available

USDA Rural Development Guaranteed Rural Housing Loans for Single Family Dwellings offers home ownership opportunities for those who want to own a home but have limited funds for a down payment. In some cases, funds for closing costs may be financed into the loan, further limiting the amount of money required to purchase a home.

Loans can be made to purchase new or existing home that meet agency requirements. New or existing stick-built and modular units may be con-

sidered, but only new manufactured housing can qualify. The homes must also meet all other agency standards.

Applicants must be without ownership of safe and sanitary housing; have adequate and dependable income with the income limits; have a credit history that indicates a willingness and ability to repay loans and obligations; be a U.S. citizens or legally admitted to the country; and have sufficient income to repay the loan.

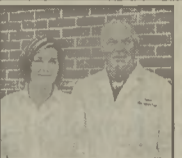

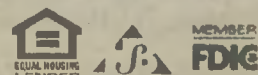
