Security for the meetings will continue to be provided by members of the Hertford Police Department who will be stationed where any troublemakers can be seen quickly when entering the building.

Council agreed to continue to meet with the front doors unlocked with the second option to be put in place should the front doors need to be locked.

According to a letter from Mark Rogerson, Perquimans County Fire Marshall, state and federal agencies that enforce violations of codes have stepped up fines and penalties following the Hamlet chicken processing plant fire where workers were killed when exit doors were locked for theft security.

Rogerson urged the town to look at several items to make sure they are not in violation of any exit requirements including:

1) making sure that any door that is in the occupied space or building has full and immediate use from the egress side while it is occupied; 2) no door may have a lock which requires more than one movement to open; 3) no key locks may be used while the building is occupied; 4) manually operated dead blots are not allowed; 5) panic hardware may not be locked while the building is occupied.
