It is a text message that will last a lifetime.

Just hours before he was

killed in a training accident, Marine Sgt. Christopher J. Jacobs texted his wife Brittany that he

sleep the night before. "I love you guys," he typed on the phone and hit the send button, transmitting his last words to his wife and young son waiting

"We love you too, baby," replied his wife.

Later that day, the 29year-old Marine was killed in an amphibious assault vehicle training exercise at the Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center at Twentynine Palms, Ca. According to the Marine Corps Times, Sgt. Jacobs was a crew-member with Delta Company, 3rd Assault Amphibian Battalion, Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center when the accident occurred Oct. 24 during a training exercise at the Marine Corps' desert
