### Hertford woman wins at state fair GOP trying

#### **Jalapeno Poppers** recipe is a winner

Becky France may need a tool belt to wear over her cooking apron when preparing her prize-winning recipe.

Her recent handcrafted recipe for Tool Box Jalapeno Poppers won her a first place blue ribbon and \$150 cash at the North Carolina State Fair over the weekend.

Plus, she won a handsome apron from Cabot Cheese, the company that sponsored the "Less Guilt - Great Recipe" contest.

When preparing her unique recipe, don't be surprised if you find her milling in her tool shed before heading to the kitchen. She uses an electric drill and propane torch to assemble and finish off her poppers

"I actually considered using a caulking gun to fill the cheesefilled poppers, but I didn't have a chance to get to the hardware store to see if they had caulking gun blanks," she laughed.

The first time competition cooker - and first time state faire competitor - grows her own Jalapeno peppers in her

## to win third board seat

Perquimans Republicans are seeking to pick up a third seat on the county Board of Commissioners in this fall's general election.

The six-member Perquimans board currently has two Republican members: chairman

Ben Hobbs and Sue Weimar. Weimar chose not to

seek re-election this fall, but two other Republicans - Kyle Jones and Matthew Peeler — are seeking to replace her and take a third seat on the board.

Democrats Janice McKenzie Cole, an incumbent commissioner, and Julie Stamper Phelps are also seeking two of the three seats up for election. Democrat Commissioner Mack Nixon is not seeking re-election.

Depending on what happens Nov 6, the Perquimans board will either continue to look the way it does now --- with four Democrats and two Repub licans — or be evenly split between the two parties.
