Scouts visit library, learn history

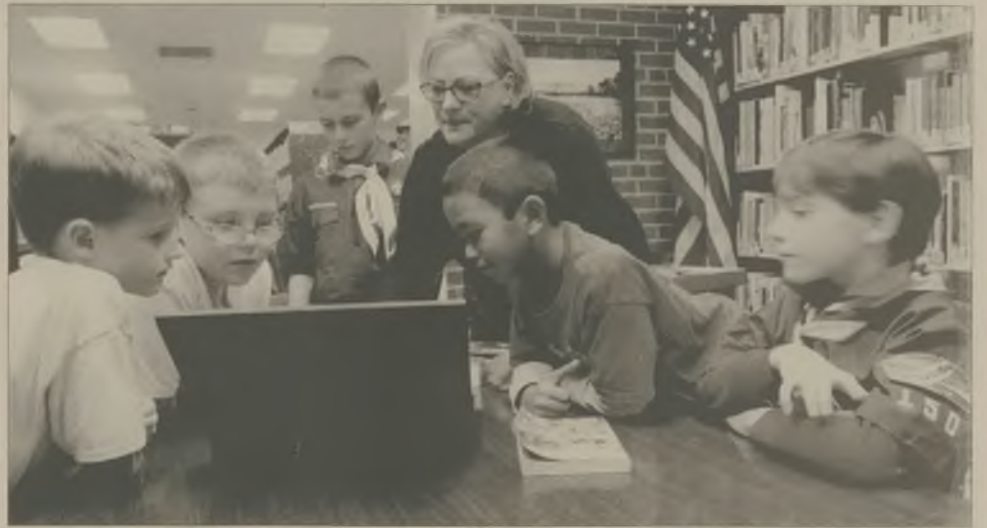

The Bear Den of Cub Scout Pack 150 visited the Perquimans County Library on Jan. 26 to learn about history.

Anita Bennett, the head of the library, pulled material to show the boys what was happening on the day they were born and again when they were five years of age.

Bennett also showed the Cubs a video of the first moon landing from the library's web site NC Live. One of the things the Scouts had to do was determine the significance of July 20, 1969, the date Apollo 11 and Americans Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin landed.

In a book called Factfinder, the Scouts found a listing of rockets that

Workshop to focus on optimizing timber

The North Carolina Cooperative Extension Centers of Gates, Chowan, and Perquimans Counties will offer a forestry workshop on optimizing timber production on Feb. 12 from 6-8 p.m. at the Merchant's Millpond Visitors Center in Gatesville. A sponsored meal will be provided. Pre-registration for this meeting is required by Feb. 9, call 357-1400 to reserve a spot.

N.C. State University Forestry Extension Specialists Dennis Hazel and James Jeuck will discuss how to op-

imize profits from your forests. They will cover some detailed considerations to fine tune timber production and improve profits, while outlining the basic practices all landowners should follow to ensure success. They will provide a brief review of recent changes in timber markets and how to grow and market timber in light of the changes.

Topics will include market prospects and market goal planning, site preparation, seedling establishment, thinning regimes, harvesting and marketing, and a comparison of economic re-

turns based on management strategy. This workshop will offer something for everyone, from new to experienced forest landowners.

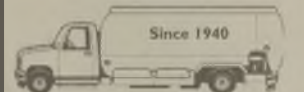
Joy

RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO PERMANENTLY CLOSE

A PORTION OF HIGH STREET WITHIN THE TOWN OF HERTFORD

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. Sections 160A-296(4) and 160A-299 a the Town of Hertford may permanently close any street or any portion thereof which has been irrevocably dedicated to the public, whether opened or unopened; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners for the Town of Hertford, North Carolina has determined that the portion of High Street described herein has been irrevocably dedicated to the public and that it may be desirable, necessary and appropriate to permanently close said portion of High Street after a public hearing held pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. Section 160A-299.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the Town of Hertford, North Carolina that:

(1) It is the intent of the Town of Hertford to permanently close the portion of High Street described below:

BEGINNING AT A POINT marked by an existing iron rod, which existing iron rod marks the southeast terminus of Phillips Street (25' R/W), and which existing iron rod is located South 25° 45' 05" East 25.00 feet from an existing iron pipe, which existing iron pipe marks the southeast corner of that property, now or formerly, owned by Jack S. & Delores R. Phillips (referencing Deed Book 99, Page 278, of the Perquimans County Public Registry); thence from said existing iron rod and POINT OF BEGINNING and running away from Phillips Street North 63° 28' 35" East 18.66 feet to an existing iron rod; thence cornering and running South 25° 35' 00" East 68.70 feet to an existing iron rod set in the northwesterly right of way margin of U.S. Highway 17 (R/W by Monuments); thence cornering and running along the northwesterly right of way margin of U.S. Highway 17 (R/W by Monuments) the following courses and distances: South 29° 06' 45" West 5.18 feet to a concrete monument; thence running South 29° 06' 45" West 17.69 feet to a calculated point; thence running South 29° 06' 45" West 30.27 feet to a calculated point; thence cornering and running away from U.S. Highway 17 North 25° 45' 05" West 98.70 feet to a point set in the southern right of way margin of Phillips Street (25' R/W); thence cornering and running along the southern right of way margin of Phillips Street (25' R/W) North 63° 28' 35" East 25.00 feet to the existing iron rod and POINT OF BEGINNING. this being that portion of High Street to be abandoned as described and delineated on that survey entitled in part, "Exhibit Map of High Street Abandonment," dated November 25, 2014, prepared by Jason A. Mizelle, Professional Land Surveyor, which survey is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

(2) A public hearing shall be held on February 9, 2015 at 7:30 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be reached, to hear any person on the question of whether or not the permanent closing of said portion of High Street would be detrimental to the public interest or property rights of any individual.

(2) A copy of this resolution shall be published once a week for four successive weeks prior to the public hearing and mailed via registered or certified mail to all owners of property adjoining the described portion of High Street as shown by the tax records of Perquimans County, and a notice of the proposed permanent closing of the described portion of High Street and public hearing shall be prominently posted in two locations along the described portion of High Street.
