Challenge of partisan gerrymandering may have impact

ALEIGH — Another month, another Republican lawmakers boldly legal challenge related to voting and admitted when they redrew the Velection fairness in North Carolina. And this one --- which challenges partisan gerrymandering of congressional districts by the Republican-led General Assembly — could have far greater impacts on voters and the future of this state than perhaps any other elections-related court case, including the challenges to the voter **ID** requirement.

Common Cause, a Washington, D.C.based good government group with a chapter in North Carolina, filed the suit in U.S. District Court in Greensboro. The group said the case could be a "watershed moment in the fight against gerrymandering."

The courts have largely avoided determining whether partisan gerrymandering - drawing election districts to benefit one political party over another — is legal.

The lawsuit alleges it is unconstitutional.

At least in part because of politically lopsided districts, since 1992, nearly half of all state legislative races have had just one candidate on the ballot, leaving millions of voters with no choice at the ballot box.

Liberal and conservative advocacy groups in North Carolina have long banged the drum for redistricting reform and many legislators publicly support it as well, but the General Assembly as a whole has resisted many opportunities to create a nonpartisan commission to draw districts.

Common Cause pointed out that both Republican Gov. Pat McCrory and his 2016 gubernatorial opponent, Democratic Attorney General Roy Cooper, are on record opposing gerrymandering.

If those two can agree, there must be a good reason.
