than \$40,000. According to Bob Clinkscales, the president of the school foundation, the money received through the trust is not "restricted" which means the dollars can be used for any of the programs and projects that the foundation currently sponsors. However, in speaking with the Crawford family, the foundation board believes it was the intent of Mr. and Mrs. Crawford to create an endowment to offer scholarships to underprivileged students.

Brenda Lassiter, executive director of the foundation, confirmed foundation board voted unanimously to establish the John and Betty Crawford Scholarship for graduating seniors from Perquimans County High School. The scholarship will begin with the graduating class of 2017 or 2018, depending on the timing of the liquidation of the trust.


