round-up of all things Perquimans County... **Perquimans County** farmer Matt Perry produced a soybean yield of 71.4 bushels per acre - the highest recorded yield in the Camden, Currituck, Pasquotank, and Perquimans area. Perry took top honors for farming skills at the Soybean Festival hosted by the Pasquotank County Cooperative Extension in January at Elizabeth

City State University. Because of farmers like Perry, soybeans are king in the northeastern corner of the state. In 2018, Pasquotank ranked second in the state, producing 2.1 million bushels. Perquimans County was sixth, harvesting 1.7 million

Sunday was Groundhog Day, which revealed that there may be an early spring. Punxsutawney Phil did not see his shadow, predicting an early or late spring during the 134th Groundhog Day festivities in Punxsutawney, Pa. Not going to jinx the forecast, but so far it's been a mild winter.
