

A first dose Mass Vaccination Clinic will be held today, Thursday Jan 28, beginning at 9 a.m. until supplies are deplet-

The clinic will be held at the Perquimans County Recreation Center located at 310 Granby Street in Hertford.

Residents that are 65 and over, healthcare providers, and first responders are welcome to attend on a first come, first served basis. No registration is needed for first dose vaccination clinics.

"Wait times could be extended so we encourage you to bring snacks, bottled water, and a book or some form of entertainment to help with the wait," Perquimans Emergency Services Director Jonathan Nixon said.

Two portable toilets have also been placed along the traffic route for your use. Please be patient with as these folks are working hard to ensure that all of residents receive their vaccination as quickly as possible.

Chesapeake police notified Pasquotank-Camden Central Communications at 12:16 a.m. that they were pursuing a stolen 2013 Ford F-130 pickup about \$3,000.

Jones said his deputies, us-According to Camden Sher- ing spiked "stop strips," attempted to stop the pickup intersection. The driver of the ern counties before ending in stolen vehicle, however, managed to avoid the strips by Jones said his deputies driving over into a turn lane

At some point while still in Camden, a deputy tried to pass the truck and get in front of it, Jones said. The driver of the pickup, however, swerved to the right, causing the truck strips; however, the driver still to collide with the side of the deputy's vehicle.
