BEST SAFETY PLAQUE FOR PLANT 8! Marchant Cottingham, Assistant General Manager of Erwin Mills, Inc., presents the annual Erwin safety plaque for 1951 to Superintendent C. O. Walker of Erwin Plant 8, Wall, Miss. This is the second time in three years that Plant 8 has won first place in the annual company-wide safety contest. In 1949, Plant 8 won first place honors with Plant 6 when both had lost time frequency ratings of zero. During 1951, with a total of 1,335,636 man-hours worked, Plant 8's rating was 1.49. The average frequency rating for the entire Erwin plant is 4.89, which is far below the entire textile industry rating of 10.0. Speaking at the presentation ceremony are M. R. Harden, Resident Manager of Plant 8, and the departmental foremen.
