RALEIGH — As an incentive for continuing interest in improving services and efficiency in the Social Services program of North Carolina, the State Board of Social Services has implemented an awards system for rewarding employees on state and county staffs who submit suggestions which may later be approved, adopted or recommended by the Board.

An award of \$100 and a Certificate of Recognition from the Governor will be given for suggestions which are implemented. Jimmy Jacumin, chairman of the State Board says, "Some of the greatest improvements in products and their production by industry have come from suggestions by employees. We feel that in the area of services provided for people by social services staff across the state, improvements can be made and efficiency improved. We are sure that the staff members at the county level who are working directly with the people have some good ideas on how we can better serve them."

NEW DISTRICT DIRECTOR APPOINTED

Greensboro — The Internal Revenue Service today announced the promotion of Charles O. DeWitt as District Director of the Greensboro IRS District.

DeWitt succeeds John E. Wall, who retired last January.

Robert A. LeBaube, who has served as Acting District Director for North Carolina since January, will continue in that capacity until DeWitt reports for duty.

The Greensboro IRS District serves all of North Carolina. In the fiscal year ended June 30, 1972, the district's individual and corporation taxpayers filed 1.8 million returns, representing \$3.3 billion in federal taxes.

A career government official, DeWitt began his IRS service in 1951 as deputy collector in Pittsburgh, Pa. After holding a series of increasingly responsible positions in Pittsburgh, Chicago, Washington, D. C. and Atlanta, he was selected in 1967 for the IRS Executive Development Course.

The IRS Executive Selection and Development Program is one in which officials who demonstrate executive potential receive specialized training in preparation for higher level appointments.

Upon completing the program, DeWitt served as Assistant District Director in Greensboro and, most recently, as District Director in Wilmington, Del.

A native of Pittsburgh, Pa., DeWitt, 47, earned a certificate in accounting at Robert Morris College.

He is married to the former Virginia Hargrave of Wilkesboro, Pa. They have four children.
