# **Twenty Chosen** For Political **Fellowships**

Twenty North Carolinians chosen for leadership capability will become fellows in the North Carolina Institute of Politics.

The Institute, fourth of its kind in the nation, will consist of 13 weekend seminars that cover broad political topics and will include a series of nationally-known speakers. Director of the Institute is twice monthly from June Dr. Walter De Vries, an twice monthly from Januassociate professor at Duke University, in the Institute of Policy Sciences & Public Affairs.
