Speaking with extreme self-confidence, Preston added, "I chose nursing as a major because I've always liked to help people. Also the field is wide open and there will always be a need for nurses." was the first male nursing student to graduate from A&T. A man of variable experiences, Smith has worked in a mental institution as a psychiatric attendant

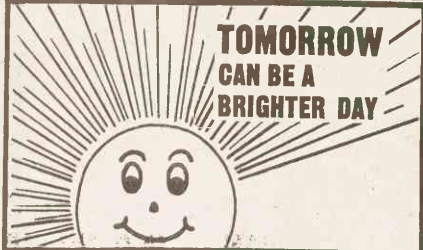

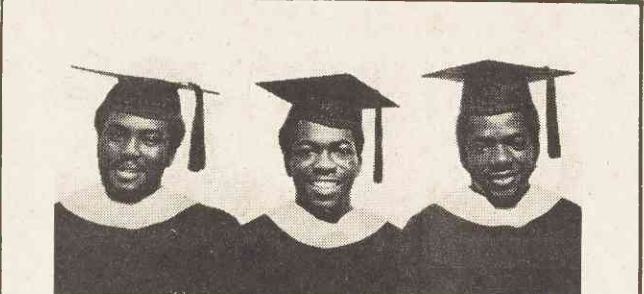

FRED GUIDRY'S THREE SONS WILL EARN MORE IN 1973 THAN HE HAS EARNED FOR 200 YEARS.

Fred Guidry's three sons have an earning potential he only dreamed of. But they might never have made it without the United Negro College Fund.
