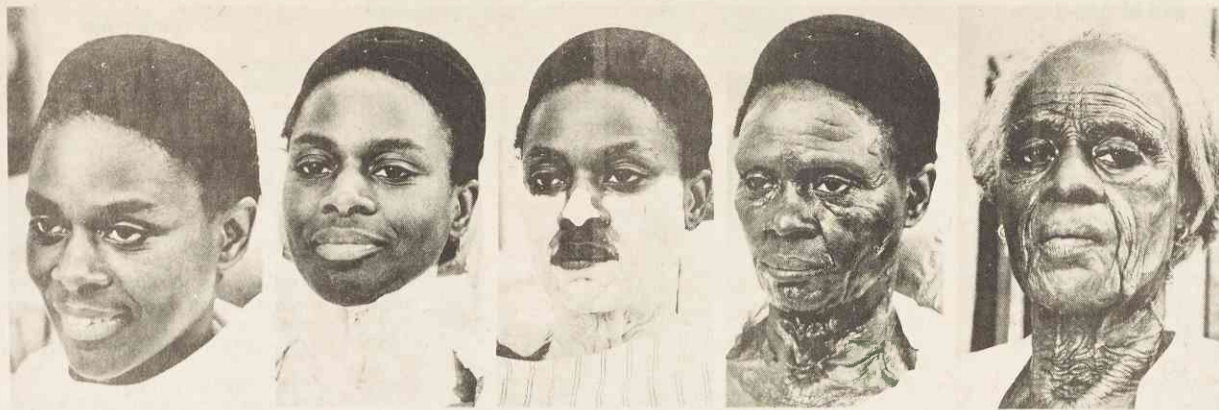

DRAMA STARS CICELY TYSON

"It's very difficult for me to play a role if I don't feel the situation is real, if only for a moment," says Cicely Tyson, whose performance in the motion picture "Sounder" brought her an Academy Award nomination. "For me, acting is believing."

Miss Tyson stars in the title role of a 110-year-old

woman who recalls her lifetime, from the Civil War to the civil rights movement, in "The Autobiography of Miss Jane Pittman," a two-hour fictional drama special to be presented Thursday, Jan. 31 (9:00 - 11:00 PM, EDT) on the CBS Television Network, and WFMY-TV, Channel 2.

"I suppose I approach a role organically, or inside-out," Miss Tyson reflects, both hands flying instinctively to her stomach to indicate a center of feeling. "I don't think out a role intellectually. Therefore, I tried to feel what it was like to be Jane Pittman, to have lived so long and lost so much."

To prepare for her role in the drama, Miss Tyson spent several days with elderly women in a retirement home. "Those women fascinated me," she recalls. "I'll never forget when one 104-year-old woman closed her eyes, leaned back and told me, 'I'm just tired.' That's when I understood best what it must be like -- a

"Those women helped me tremendously in playing Jane Pittman," Miss Tyson emphasizes, "not because I copied the, but because they shared with me the perspective and quiet dignity that comes with old age. If I learned one thing from this role, it was a deep respect for people who have been down the road."
