We have been toying with the idea of responding by sending a photograph of Walter Clinton Jackson, the Library, which will show that we are partially white and partially brick colored.



Q. When will I get my re-fund? A. Yes, but you must meet certain qualifications. On Form 1040, your income must be \$20,000 or less on line 15 and be made up only of wages or

certain qualifications. On Form 1040, your income must be \$20,000 or less on line 15 and be made up only of wages or salaries, and tips, dividends, interest, pensions and annu-ities. In addition, you must choose the standard deduction and file by the due date. Then the IRS will figure your tax for you.
