The Child Advocacy Section of the Office for Children of the Department of Human Resources is interested in finding solutions to the problems of these children regardless of whether they are physically, intellectually, emotionally, or culturally different; abused, neglected or excluded; rich or poor.

Marian Durham, a coun selor with the Child Advocacy Section, said, "We are available to help children with all types of problems. If we cannot help the child, we know where to direct him for the services he needs."

There are four regional directors (Black Mountain, Greensboro, Favetteville and Greenville) and 20 field staff consultants available to help children with problems. Each county in North Carolina is assigned to a field consultant.
