Soul Train's Coming Attraction

Singers-musicians Bloodstone, and vocalists Carl Douglas and Syl Johnson will be featured on Soul Train this weekend, June 19, WTVD-TV, Channel 11, soul entertainment show produced by Don Cornelius Productions.

Fresh from the critical success of their latest album, "Riddle of the Sphinx," which presents a creative concept far different from their usual soulful sound, Bloodstone sing the opening number, "For the First Time," as well as "My Little Lady."

The Department of Justice filed a civil suit today charging the operators of a Chicago, Illinois apartment building with refusing to rent apartments to blacks. Attorney General Edward H. Levi said the housing discrimination suit was filed in U.S. District Court in Chicago against George A. and James A. Mueller, operators of the GFM Corporation of Chicago.
