(High Point Mental Health Association)

An adult Growth and Parent Education Course will begin on October 6 at the Southside Multi-Purpose Center. The course will meet on Monday evenings from 7 - 10 p.m. for eight weeks (through November 24). The registration fee is \$3.00. Textbooks are optional and may be purchased at the first class meeting. Enrollment is limited to the first 24 to call the Human Relations Commission at 883-2787.

The course is open to parents of children of all ages, to single parents, teachers and youth sponsors. This "on the job" training course was developed at Barium Springs Home for Children, a Presbyterian Family Service Agency. It is now being taught all over the state of North Carolina. Over 200 persons have taken the course at other locations in the High Point area. The course is based on two very popular books, "Parent Effectiveness Training" by Dr. Thomas Gordon, and "Your Child's Self-Esteem" by Dorothy Briggs.

The instructor for the course will be Homer Phifer, minister of the First Presbyterian Church in Thomasville. The course is being sponsored by the Mental Health Association, Family Life Council and the Human Relations Commission.

(Library Hours Change at Branch Library)

Smith has been a Century Club member of the Y.M.C.A. (\$100.00 Club).

A former Dean of the Technical Institute at A&T State University in Greensboro (1951 - 1967), Mr. Smith was Assistant State Supervisor of Trade and Industrial Education (1941 - 1951). He initiated Project Uplift, the North Carolina High School Industrial Students Organization and has served as a member of the Governor's Advisory Committee on Manpower Development and Training.

The political scene has felt the effects of Mr. Smith's influence while he twice served as campaign manager for State Legislator Henry Frye, the first black in N.C. to win such a political seat.

As a member of St. James Presbyterian Church, the Greensboro Senior Citizen serves as an elder. He is also moderator of the Yadkin Presbytery, and Commissioner to the General Assembly

in New York from Yadkin Presbytery.

Mr. Smauel C. Smith is truly a humanitarianist supreme, and don't think his numerous achievements have been unnoticed until now. He has been listed in "Who's Who in America" and "Who's Who in the South and Southwest".
