standing among different ethnic groups and formulate a set of attitudes, a code of personal morals and ethics, develop self-respect, self-confidence, self-motivation, self-direction. This involves a formation of several group clubs and leadership growth seminars.

(3) **CULTURAL PROGRAMS:** To encourage creativity pride in work, self-expression. This includes arts and crafts classes, individual guidance, woodshop classes, music appreciation, and drop-in activities.

(4) **PHYSICAL EDUCATION:** To develop physical fitness and teach sound personal health concepts and practices. This includes screening for the physically undeveloped, seasonal athletics, daily fitness programs, low organized activities, tournaments and contest in activities.

(5) **SOCIAL RECREATION:** To prepare for the constructive and creative use of one's leisure time now and in adult life. Provide activities that will encourage friendly competition and fair play and eliminate all inappropriate behaviors.

In 1975 the operating budget of the Boys' Club is \$47,000.00. Forty-six thousand dollars comes from the United Way of Gaston County. \$1,000 comes from McAdenville Community Chest.

In comparison to a thousand other Boys' Clubs in the country, Gaston Boys' Club would be considered an average sized operation.

Under the dynamic leadership of the Executive Director, Mr. Vernon L. Perry, the Club effectuates a program based upon the needs and interests of the boys which the Club serves.

Mr. Perry states, "We add quality programming of fun, but fun with a purpose. The purpose being to prepare our young men to live as productive members of our society and in peaceful coexistence with his fellowman."

The membership age for the Club is 6 - 18 years. The cost of the membership is 50 cents (\$.50) per year with the membership year running from September 1 to August 31.

A boy needs only to stop by the Club and request a membership application which

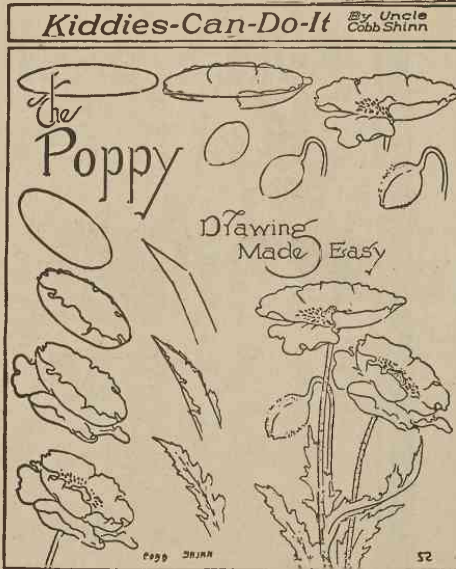
is to be filled out by his parents (unless he is 16 - 18 years, he may fill out his own). Upon returning the completed card he brings the fee and is issued a Boys' Club membership card.

Membership files are broken down into four categories:

- 6-10 . . . Midget . . . Code "M"
  - 11-13 . . . Junior . . . Code "J"
  - 14-16 . . . Int . . . Code "I"
  - 17-18 . . . Senior . . . Code "S"
- (The above codes are reflected on each of the membership cards.)

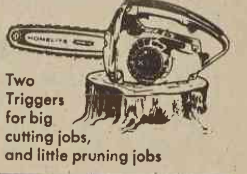
