Q. We bought some Series E Savings Bonds for our grand-child and listed her as co-owner. We would like to trans-fer the bonds to her name. Are we responsible for any of the interest? A Although the bonds are held


A. Although the bonds are held jointly, since you actually

of the transfer. You should in-clude the interest in your in-come for the year the bonds were reissued in your grand-child's name. If the bonds had been taken out in the child's name, all the income would be the child's even though you paid for the bonds.

Q. We are renting the second floor of our house and require the tenants to pay a security deposit equal to one month's rent. Is this considered part of the rent and should we report it as income?

A. Security deposits are not considered rent or income when they are received, unless they are applied to the rent payment for the last month of the lease. These they are considered and Then they are considered advance rental income and must be reported in the year they are received.

If all or part of the deposit is kept because the tenant defaults, it should be reported as income at the time it is appro-priated for back rent.
