The Greatest Back At FSU

FAYETTEVILLE — James Godwin, a native of Fayetteville, North Carolina, and a student majoring in business administration at Fayetteville State University, may be one of the greatest athletes ever to walk on the campus of the North Carolina-based institution.

Not only has Godwin excelled as a track star, having gained All-American status his junior year, but he is definitely a potential All-American candidate because of his gridiron feats.

His track coach Walter Johnson has nothing but praise for the 200 pound six-footer who has been clocked in the 40-yard dash at 4.4 speed.

"James is a real dedicated

athlete," said Johnson, "In fact, he is one of the most dedicated young men I've had the pleasure of being around."

Johnson, an alumnus of N. C. Central University and a product of famed track mentor Leroy Walker, has guided Godwin to record holding titles in the state and nation for the broad jump and relay.

Football-wise, Godwin has probably broken, or made records at Fayetteville State last year when he rushed for more than one-thousand yards and nine touchdowns.

At every game so far this season, FSU has a 3 - 1 record, professional scouts have marveled at Mr. Godwin's exploits.

In Atlanta, Georgia, recently against Morehouse College, Godwin rushed for a game

total of 265 yards with touchdowns runs of 19 and 54 yards, respectively.

So far this season, Godwin has galloped for a 56 yard tally, his longest, and has rushed for 483 yards in 73 carries for an average of 120 yards per contest.

He also leads the team in scoring with five TDs and 30 points. Last season, Godwin finished second in conference rushing and was named to the All-CIAA conference team. The Broncos had a 4 - 7 season.

A very mild-natured gentleman, on and off the field, Godwin feels that he can surpass last year's heroics although FSU has a 10-game slate this year.

"Godwin is a team-oriented player despite his natural

talents," said coach Ray McDougal, "and he is an exceptional blocker and is very quick."

This Mr. Godwin is not a bad athlete at all. Especially, since he just started playing football or "learned to play" during his last two years of high school.

Elizabeth City State's Johnny Williams has taken over the total offense leadership with a 161.7 game average. The freshman quarterback has five touchdown passes.

Norfolk State's Roscoe Powell is the conference's leader in kickoff returns with a scintillating 28.8 average, Rufus Crawford, Va. State, is second with a 25.5 average.

RICHMOND, Va. — Livingstone College's defense is among the leaders in statistics, according to information released from the CIAA Service Bureau today.

Coach Baxter Holman's Livingstone Bears are the league's total defense leader allowing only 86.7 yards per game. The Bears are real stingy on the ground as opponents have been able to only average 22.7 yards per game. The pass defense of the Bears has allowed only 19 completions for a 64.0 yard game average.

Fayetteville State's James Godwin continues to lead the offensive stats with a 114.4 yards per game rushing average. Godwin has racked up 572 yards for an average of 6.0 per carry. The bruising fullback also is third in total offense and second in scoring with 36 points.

Elizabeth City State's Johnny Williams has passed for two touchdowns — 70 yards and 3 yards — to lead the

Fayetteville State, led by the rushing combo of Godwin and Tim Heath, leads the league in rushing with a fine 210.8 per game average. Norfolk State is second.

James Woodson, St. Paul's fleet wide receiver, leads the CIAA with 32 receptions for 528 yards and seven touchdowns. Elizabeth City State's Mike Hill follows with 25 receptions and three touchdowns.

Saint Paul's led by quarterback Sam Cosby and Woodson leads the CIAA in passing offense with a 196.4 game average. The Tigers have completed 76 passes for 982 yards.

Elizabeth City State's Alfred Holmes leads the conference punters with a 44.0 punt average.

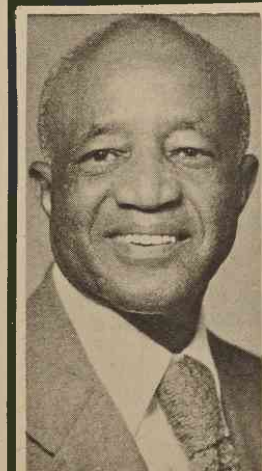
