cants are high school seniors and therefore qualify for four year scholarships, Speight said. Scholarships are maintained during the four year period as long as the recipients are full-time students who are not on academic probation. They must also remain in the teaching program agreed upon.

Loan recipients repay their obligation to the state by teaching in North Carolina public schools one year for each year's award. If they choose not to teach in the state, students may repay loans in cash at a six percent interest rate. Awards made prior to this year are repayable at a four percent interest rate.
