GREENSBORO--Four more "big champion, Lee Trevino, Lou Graham, 2 The portly Californian rallied some-names" have committed themselves for 1975 U.S. Open champ, and J.C. Snead. what in the '75 season, rising from 35th on the money list to 14th with one victory season.


