Others scoring and playing well for Chavis were Ken Baldwin 8 points, Lamont Johnson 4, Victor Walls, 2, and Dwayne Phillips 2.

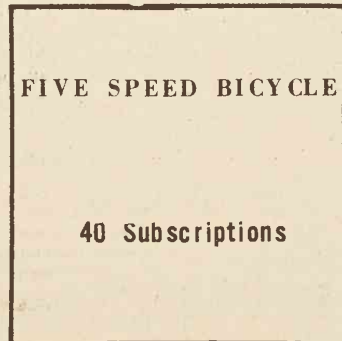

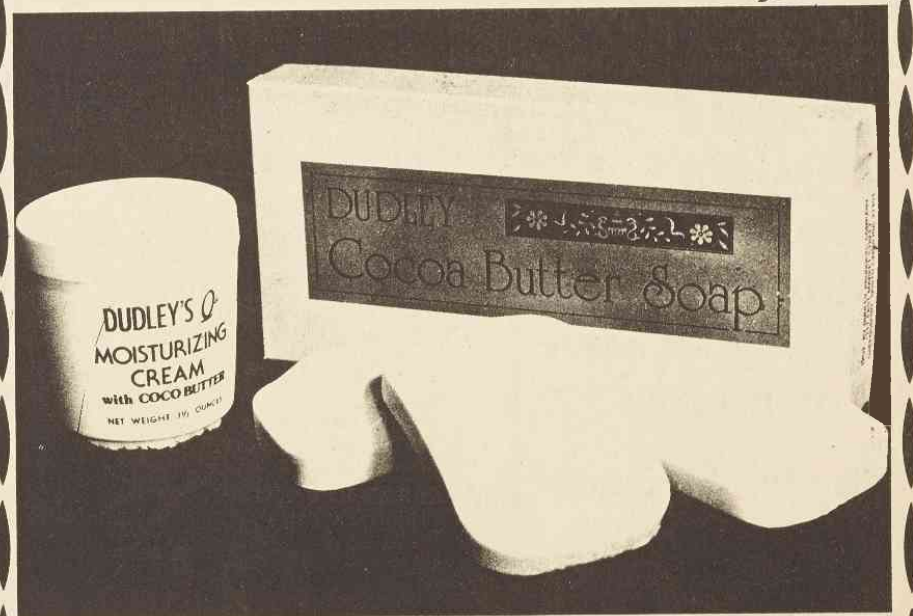
