## GGO Qualifying Set

**GREENSBORO** - Joe Moss, General Chairman of the 1976 Greater Greensboro Open, has announced that Monday Qualifying for the 1976 GGO will be held at Forest Oaks Country Club in Greensboro, North Carolina.

This will mark the third year in a row that Qualifying has been held at Forest Oaks. The official measurement of the course is 6,958 yards, with a par of 72. However, according to Forest Oaks officials, the measurements were taken from the center of the Blue Tees to the Center of the Green, making the actual play a good distance longer - playing slightly over 7,100 yards.

The course has been described by previous qualifiers as a very tough course. The greens are large and contain very subtle breaks.

Moss also pointed out that the TPD/PGA has eliminated Pre-Qualifying. Those eligible to qualify on

Monday are restricted to TPD card holders and the 15 members of the Carolinas Section of the PGA who have been determined as eligible by the Section.

Amateurs and PGA members not designated by the Section as eligible to qualify must apply for and receive one of the eight Sponsors Exemptions in order to participate in a TPD co-sponsored tournament.

Qualifying for the 1976 GGO will be held on Monday, March 29. Deadline for entry in the Qualifying is 6:00 p.m., Monday, March 22.
