## Shaw Grad Appointed Executive Minister

RALEIGH--The Reverend James D. Peters, Jr., a graduate of Shaw University, has been appointed Executive Minister, South Region of the Board of Directors of the American Baptist Churches.

Mr. Peters now serves as the National Director of the New Community Program of the Fund of Renewal (FOR). He will assume the position September 1, 1976. In 1971, the predomi-

nantly white American Baptist Churches in the USA and the predominantly black Progressive National Baptist Convention Inc., jointly undertook a capital funds campaign to raise \$7.5 million in distributable

monies to deal with specific educational and community needs of Asian-Americans, Indian-Americans, Blacks

and Hispanic-Americans. Mr. Peters said he looked forward to his relationship with churches in the south

because "the challenge of working with and continuing to expand this exciting, inclusive fellowship represents an extension of the New Community concept."

In his new post, Mr. Peters will provide spiritual guidance and administrative leadership to more than 155 congregations affiliated with the region of the south. The administrative area itself stretches

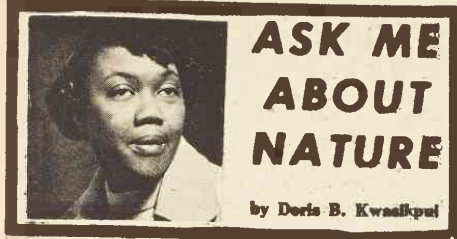
