Some of the historic highlights of Brother Spaulding's career are: first actuary of the National Negro Insurance Association and president for two terms of this organization; named an Honorary Admiral in the North Carolina Navy; and the receiving of a citation "for his unselfish devotion in helping to stabilize our economy" from a United States president. Brother Spaulding has been a member of the Board of Directors of the NAACP Legal Defense Fund, Inc. and he has served on the Board of Directors of many large corporations such as the Board of W.T. Grant Company of New York. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the National Conference of Christians and Jews; has received the Civic Honor Award from the Durham Chamber of Commerce and a few years ago he was the recipient of the "Distinguished Citizen's Award" from the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of North Carolina. He has been the author of many scholarly publications and he is listed in most of the "Who's Who" books.

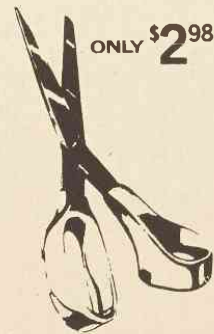
Mrs. Jeane Gregory was Narrator, and Miss Gloria garvin and Miss Emma J. Friday were panel members.

Children Needing Homes

His lovable smile hides the hurt he feels deep inside. He's been disappointed for a long time. The months and years keep rolling by but still he is hoping that someday soon a permanent home can be found for him.

Rick has been in foster care, in another area of the state, for more than four years. Nine year-old, he is an alert, imaginative boy of Black-Spanish heritage. Having known much instability and uncertainty, Rick needs adoptive parents who are patient and understanding. He is an intelligent young fellow with a great deal of potential abilities which need to be developed.

Children's Home Society of North Carolina is looking for an adoptive family who can help Rick to feel secure and loved. Adoptive homes are also needed for other black or bi-racial youngsters, children of all ages from infancy up to twelve years old.

The Society has no rigid requirements for persons adopting a child with special needs. Not every family can successfully parent an older child who has experienced considerable insecurity. Each application is considered on an

individual basis in relation to the type of child the adoptive applicant is interested in.

Children's Home Society is North Carolina's only statewide, voluntary, non-sectarian adoption agency and has specialized skills and experience in helping parents and a child become a family together through adoption. Founded in 1903, the Society has worked cooperatively for many years with county Departments of Social Service in homefinding and adoption planning for children in public foster care. In addition to placing several hundred infants each year from the Society's direct care, CHS has provided adoptive placement, in the last eight years, for 410

children referred from other agencies.

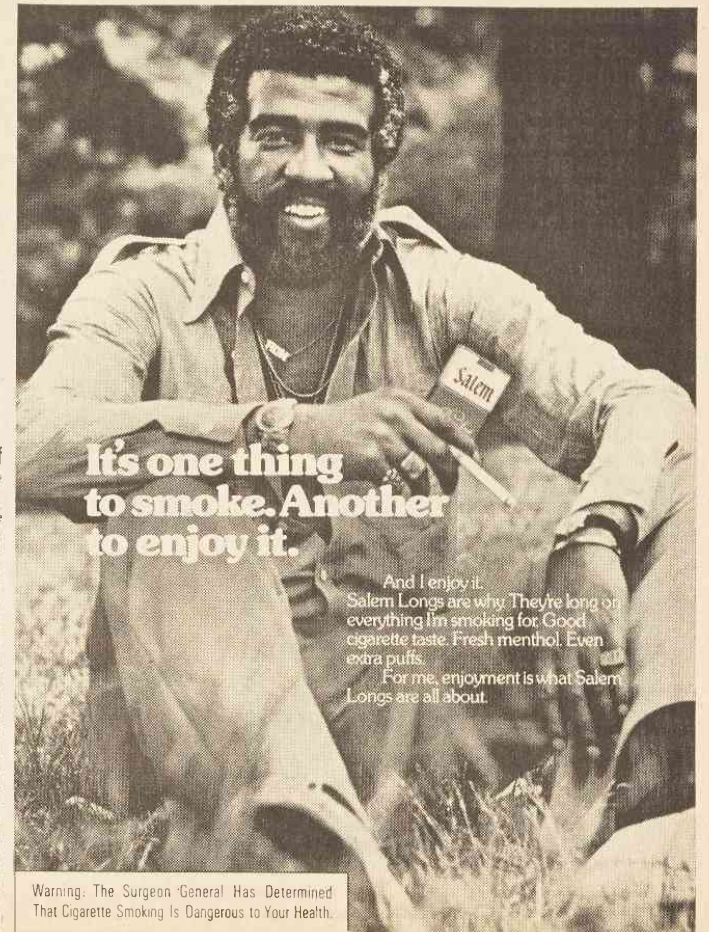
