### Food Prices Drop As Inflation Eases Up

The Division of State Budget's latest cost-of-living survey in the state re-veals that while inflation only slowed down from Oc-tober to April, overall food prices dropped for the first

substantially lower meat and poultry prices are primarily responsible for lowering the cost of the market basket by 1.3 percent. The 7.5 percent lower meat and poultry prices, however, only served to offset the 18.8 percent they rocketed during the previous sixment by the previou month survey period, from April to October, 1975.

semi-annual survey is based on the prices of 132 items in categories includ-ing homeownership, food, fuel and utilities, public transportation, medical carem hotels, and restaur-ant meals. Of these items, 48 percent cost more, 28 percent cost less, and 24 percent cost the same as they did in October, 1975.

Public transportation saw the greatest price hike, with railroad and airline fares up almost 8 percent. Adding to the cost of instate travel is a 5.1 percent




