GOD BLESS THE CHILDREN

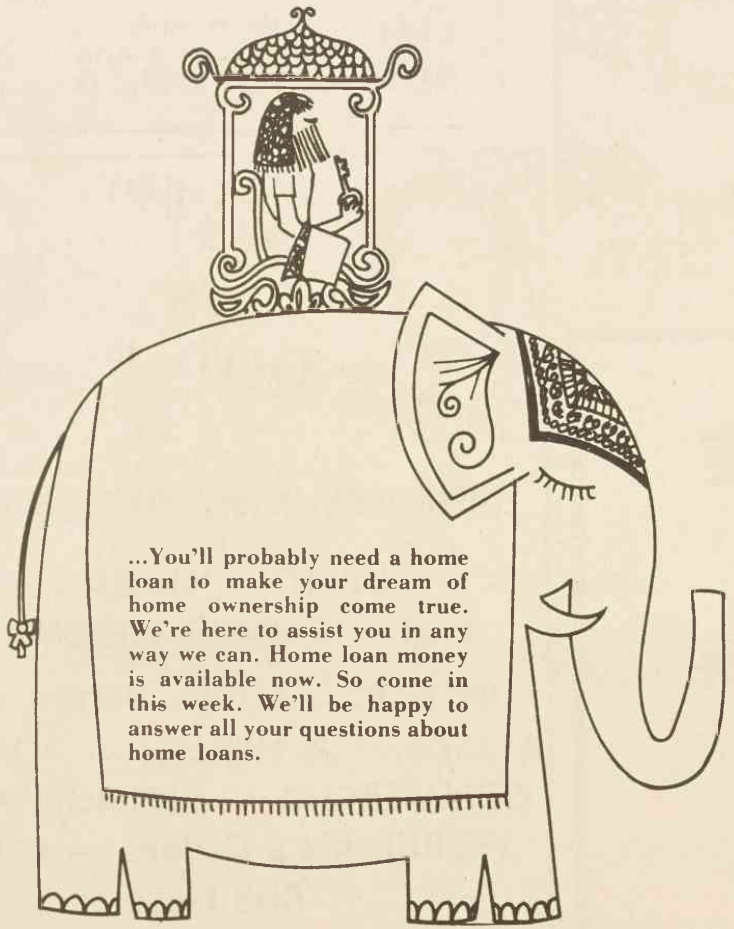
The children are ours to shape and to mold

Program Provides Jobs For Persons 55 And Up

WASHINGTON — More than 18,000 workers, 55 and over, were provided federally subsidized, part-time community service jobs in the 9 months ending March 31, Secretary of Labor W. J. Usery, Jr., has announced.

Black workers accounted for 20 percent of the 13,210 participants who were in the program as of March 31.

The older workers, all economically disadvantaged, were participants in the Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP). Wages are subsidized by the U.S. Labor Department.

The Labor Department spent \$24,140,000 for the program from July 1, 1975 through March 31, 1976.

SCSEP participants work in a wide variety of activities in such places as day care centers, schools, hospitals, senior citizen centers, and on beautification, conservation and restoration projects.

The program also provides participants with annual physical examinations, personal and job-related counseling, job training and, in some cases, placement into regular unsubsidized jobs. Participants' wages average about \$2.40 per hour.

SCSEP is an alternative to welfare. It offers the communities a federally supported pool of workers that can be drawn upon to enhance existing services or to create new ones.

Of the 13,210 in the program on March 31, male and female participants were about evenly divided, 72 percent were between the ages of 55 and 69.

SCSEP projects are sponsored primarily by 5 national organizations: Green Thumb, Inc. (an arm of the National Farmers Union); the National Council on the Aging, the National Council of Senior Citizens, the National Retired Teachers Association - American Association of Retired Persons; and the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service. These organizations sponsor all SCSEP projects now being conducted in 47 states, Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico.

SCSEP is authorized by Title IX of the Older Americans Amendments of 1975 and includes projects which were formerly conducted under the National Older Workers Program - Operation Mainstream.
