

# Knoxville College Receives Contribution

KNOXVILLE, TN. Dr. Robert Harvey, Acting-President, Knoxville College has announced the receipt of a contribution as the initial portion of a \$10,000 pledge to the college's fund raising campaign for United Negro College Fund. The contribution was presented by Jake F. Butcher, Chairman, United American Bank.

Thomas A. Murphy, Chairman of the Board General Motors, Inc., serves as the 1976 national campaign director of UNCF, an organization devoted since 1944 to securing funds for black higher learning institutions. According to a quota sent by the national office of UNCF, local funds raised by Knoxville College are multiplied almost seven times in money dele-

gated to Knoxville's predominately black college. Thus, if the \$30,000 local campaign goal can be met, this amount will bring more than \$200,000 to Knoxville College, according to Dr. Harvey. There are 41 Negro colleges funded by UNCF, which in 1975 raised \$12.1 million in contributions and earnings.

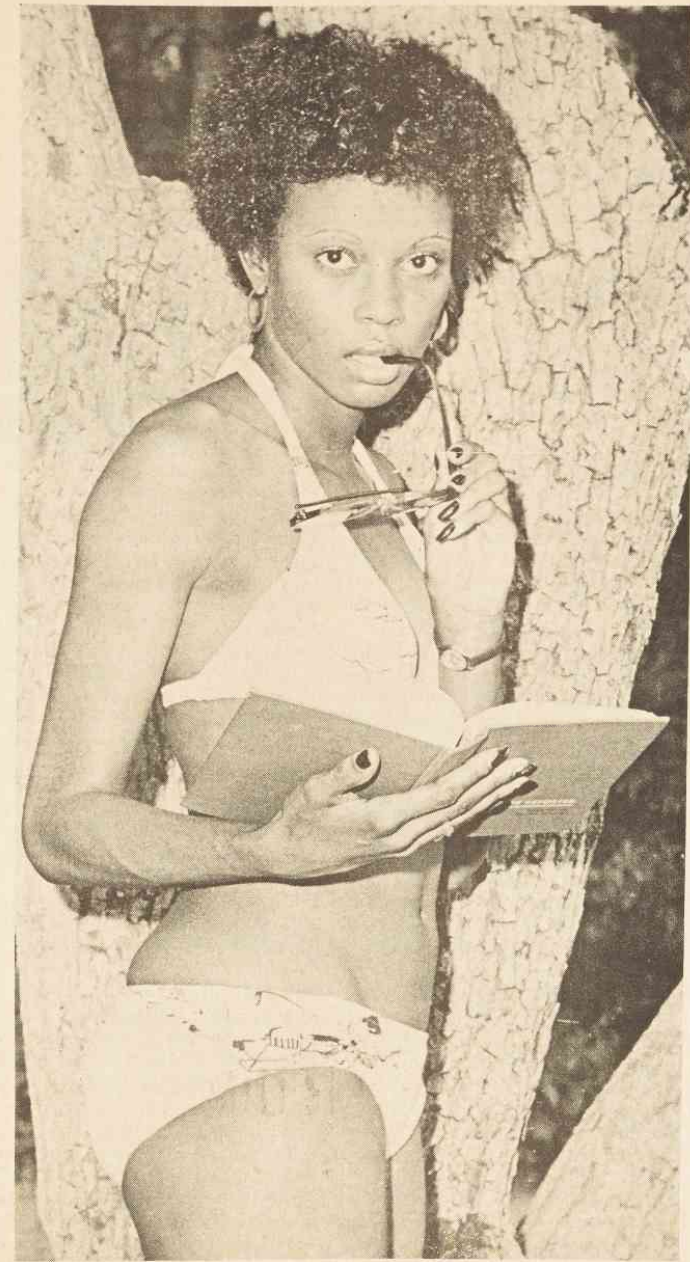
Of the money allotted to Knoxville College by UNCF, \$55,000-\$70,000 is used for operating expense such as salaries, maintenance, and supplies. The remainder provides scholarships for promising students many of whom are economically deprived and would otherwise be denied a college education.

Mr. Butcher, in making the presenta-

tion, stated that he hoped United American Bank's example would prompt other business in East Tennessee to join in the support of the nation's

Negro colleges and universities, all of which rely heavily on financial support from private institutions. "We can think of no better way to strength-

en our community than by helping to provide the opportunity for higher learning for all the people of East Tennessee," Butcher stated.

North Carolina last year were mobile homes that have estimated life of seven years and are financed at an average rate of 18%. These facts argue convincingly for the proposed solution of combining mass produced quality housing with dimensional stability in the same manner that has been accomplished in the automobile, airplane and appliance industry; providing 55 year economic life, low maintenance cost, and the elimination of archaic high cost inefficient

labor practices. The principals have spent over three years and invested \$500,000 in research, development, patent rights, prototypes, renderings, plans, specifications, and Federal, State and Municipal approvals. Detailed analyses were made of similar research and development studies by Aluminum Corporation of America, U.S. Steel, U.S. Plywood, U.S. Bureau of Standard and all other available studies in the housing field.

For years he was chief cook at Truby Upchurch's Clubhouse near Knightdale where he has had the occasion to cook for many outstanding local, state and national leaders of our country. He is proud of the fact that North Carolina Governors Thomas W. Bickett, Luther Hodges and Kerr Scott were some of his regular customers.

Brother Wray is married to Mrs. Maude Wray and they are the parents of eleven children.

Mount Pisgah Lodge is to be congratulated for giving due honor to the Loyal Brother for it is the dedication of Brothers such as Brother Wray to have helped to build up the Grand Lodge through years of problems to years of prosperity that it now has.
